



TRIAL GARDEN INTERN

POSITION DESCRIPTION

We are looking for an enthusiastic, detail-oriented student who is pursuing a degree in horticulture and/or related plant science field. Ideal candidates will be resourceful, responsible, self-motivated and have a passion for their work and engaging with others. Primarily the intern will work independently, but will also assist with garden maintenance tasks, as needed. This is a paid internship during the summer (May-August), for 40 hours per week.

POSITION RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Under the guidance of the Assistant Director of Horticulture, plan and map the layout of, and install annual trial garden plantings
2. Oversee the maintenance (weeding, watering, fertilizing, deadheading) of the Earth-Kind Modern Rose Trial, the American Rose Trial for Sustainability, the All-America Selections, and the Ball Horticulture Company trials at the garden
3. Collect data on all trial gardens, including pictures as required
4. Organize and evaluate trial garden data to prepare summary reports for internal and external use
5. Assist garden staff in maintaining 47 acres of gardens and natural areas, as needed
6. Assist with the turf maintenance of the Garden, including mowing and edging
7. Maintain a safe and friendly environment for Garden volunteers and visitors
8. Proper use and maintenance of basic landscape tools, including cleaning and safe storage
9. Operate hand/power tools, small machinery and vehicles (golf cart, mowers, tractors, tiller, etc.) in a safe way

EDUCATION, EXPERIENCE AND ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

1. Second year or higher student seeking degree in horticulture and/or related plant science field
2. Complete tasks demonstrating attention to detail, accuracy and thoroughness
3. Dependable, reliable and team player
4. Ability to follow directions and motivate others to complete tasks safely, efficiently, and to a high standard of excellence
5. Self-motivated, organized, attentive to details, able to manage time effectively and execute tasks independently
6. Flexibility to work in an ever-changing environment with demonstrated ability to prioritize and juggle competing tasks
7. Knowledge of plants, their growth and cultural characteristics, ability to learn plants' horticultural requirements
8. Excellent working knowledge of plant identification
9. Must be physically able to stand, kneel, or walk for extended periods of time, lift up to 50 lbs. and work outside in all types of weather conditions
10. Excellent interpersonal skills and the ability to effectively communicate with staff, volunteers and public
